#### What is the Export Support Service?

- The Export Support Service helpline and online form is the first point of contact for all UK businesses to get answers to questions about exporting their products or services to customers in Europe.
- It is a free government service run by the Department for International Trade.
- The helpline is currently operating with extended hours, open Monday to Friday from 8am to 8pm. It is the single point of contact for businesses and traders with questions about exporting to Ukraine, Russia or Belarus.
- No matter the size of your business, how much you export or where in the UK you are based, you can use the service to get answers to your questions.
- It can also help you navigate other government services, so you can find further support about trading with Europe or other countries, such as DIT's International Trade Advisers and the Export Academy.
- The Export Support Service currently focuses on questions you have about trading with Europe but will expand to cover more global markets this year.
- DIT will continue to work with businesses and business representative groups in all parts of the UK, to help make the service as useful as possible for businesses at every stage of their exporting journey.
